## What Is Envirothon?



Envirothon is a problem-solving natural resource competition for high school students in the U.S. and Canada. Three Pennsylvania soil and water conservation districts started the event in 1979. In most states and provinces, Envirothon is co-sponsored by local conservation districts and cooperating State, Federal and Provincial resource agencies. Now sponsored by Canon and called the North American Canon Envirothon, both Canadian and US teams can compete.

## Local, State and National Contests

Envirothon is a great opportunity for students to compete in a team setting, to meet people who work in environmental-related careers, and to have a good time while learning more about environmental topics! There is NO COST for participating, other than your time and the cost of traveling to the event. We hope you'll gather your friends, find an adult advisor/teacher, and sign up to represent your school or group at this great event!
